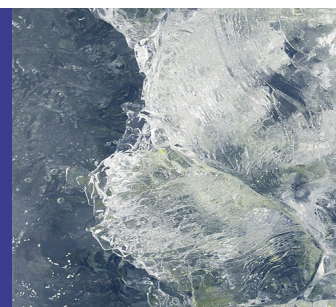

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Global Shares Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. 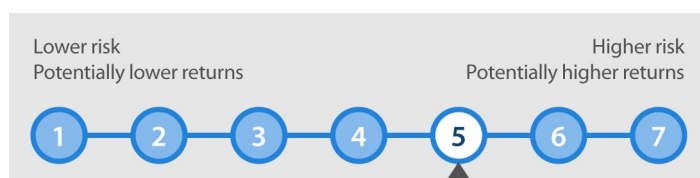
Description of this fund

The fund aims to outperform the MSCI All Countries World Index, with net dividends reinvested, expressed in NZD (unhedged) by 3.0% p.a. over a rolling three year period before fees, expenses and taxes. The Global Shares Fund seeks to provide investors with a relatively concentrated actively managed portfolio of global equities to achieve long term capital growth.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Global Shares Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

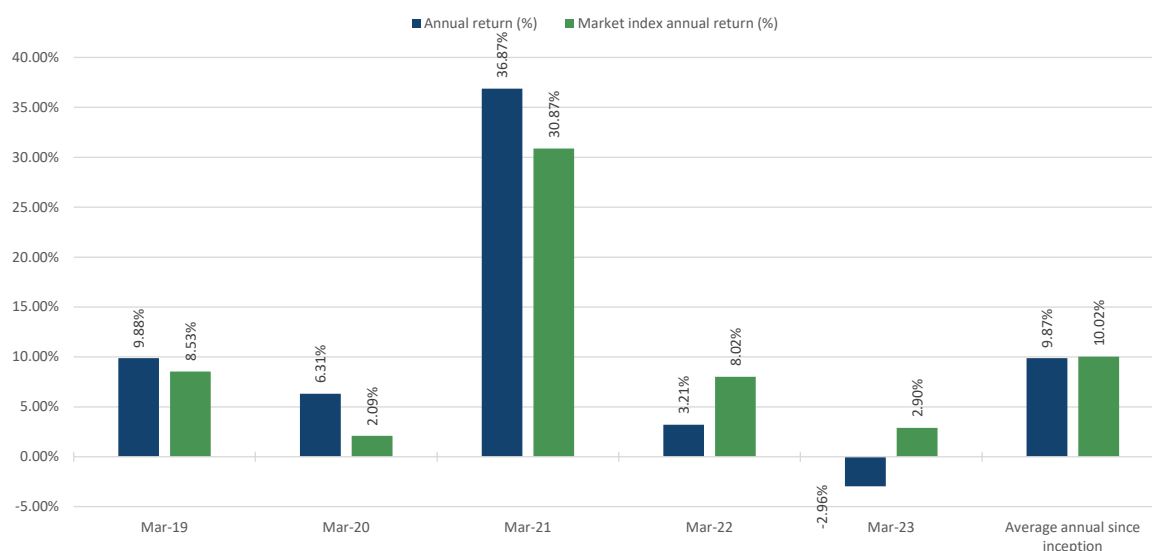
How has the fund performed?¹

Annual return graph²



This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the fund started, up to 31 March 2023.

Example of how this applies to an investor

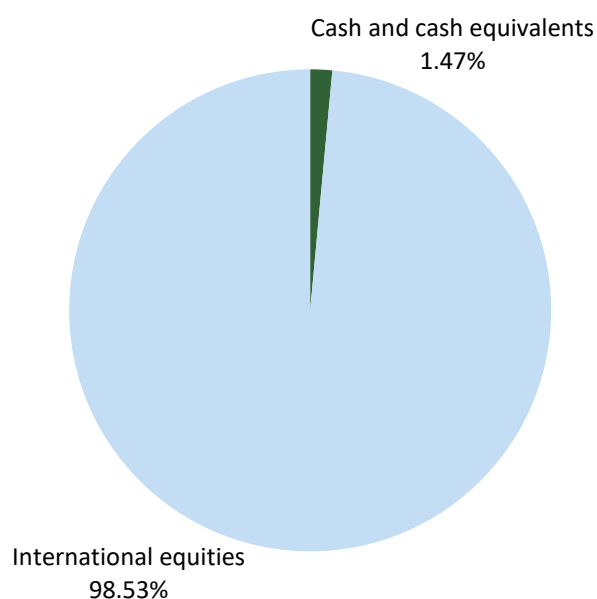
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Simon had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Simon incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$202 (that is -2.02% of his initial \$10,000). Simon also paid \$30 in other charges. This gives Simon a total loss after tax of \$326 for the year.³

What does the fund invest in?
